Prioritizing Community Health Needs and Services in Boulder City



Purpose of the Assessment What are We Doing?

- Obtain input from the community on local health and health care service needs
- Combine with the most current information on local health and health care from state and national data sources
- Assist the community, hospital board, and Boulder City Hospital with immediate community benefit reporting requirements and long-term strategic planning and development

Purpose of the Assessment Why are We Doing This?

Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (ACA) requires not-for-profit hospitals to provide a community health needs assessment:

- Every three years
- Input from the community
- Assessment findings and recommendations must be made widely available to the public

Community Health Needs Survey

- Survey conducted from September 21, 2015 to November 16, 2015
- 143 responses in total
 - 66 paper surveys
 - 77 online surveys
- 99% of respondents reside in Boulder City

What about living in our community contributes to people's health and well-being in a positive way? Q.1


- Small town atmosphere and sense of community (35%)
- Outdoor activities, walkability, bike paths, etc. (21%)
- Having a health care services in Boulder City (14%)
- Quiet, laid back lifestyle (11%)
- Sense of Safety (10%)

- Cost of health care (23%)
- Access to health care services (23%)
- Aging-related problems (15%)
- Heart disease and stroke (15%)
- Access to Medicaid/Medicare providers (13%)

In the most general terms, how would you rate the overall health of your community? Q.3




What about living here contributes to people's health and well-being in a negative way? Q.4

- Lack of health care providers, specialists, and specialty services (27%)
- Too much traffic (11%)

- Sun exposure and pollen/dust allergies (9%)


What do you think are the three most important factors for a healthy community and improving the quality of life in our community? Q.5

- Low crime and safe neighborhoods (25%)

- Supportive services for seniors (6%)


In general, how would you rate your personal health? Q.6




For how many days during the past 30 days was your physical health <u>not</u> good? Q.7

Where do you go most often for your health care? Q.9




Health Care Utilization

- 84% go to a doctor's office for most of their health care (2012 – 94%) (Q.9)
- 82% have at least one person they think of as their personal doctor or health care provider (2012 – 92%) (Q.10)
- 27% used the ER in the past 12 months (2012 – 69%) (Q.12)
- 70% visited a dentist or dental clinic in the past 12 months (2012 – 88%) (Q.14)


Health Care Costs

- 13% in the past 12 months needed to see a doctor but could not because of the cost (2012 – 9%) (Q.11)
- 24% in the past 12 months needed to visit a dentist or dental clinic but could not because of the cost (Q.13)


How many times in the past year have you used the emergency room? Q.12




How many times in the past year have you visited a dentist or dental clinic? Q.14




Do you have any kind of health care coverage, including health insurance, prepaid plans such as HMO's, or governmental plans such as Medicare? Q.15




What type of healthcare insurance do you have? Q.16




For how long have you had health insurance coverage without a lapse in coverage? Q.17

In the past year, have you received care from a hospital or medical provider other than Boulder City Hospital? Q.19




If you have used the services of another hospital or medical provider other than Boulder City Hospital in the past year, what were the reasons you went elsewhere? Q.20

- Costs were lower (9%)


About how long has it been since you last visited a doctor for a routine checkup? Q.21



- Cost of health care and acceptance of insurance (26%)
- Aging and unhealthy lifestyles (12%)
- Lack of transportation to health care facilities (9%)
- Quality of care and customer service consideration (9%)

What changes in health care services would you like to see in our community? Q.30

- More health care specialty services and providers (32%)
- Education on preventive care and services (11%)
- More doctors, especially primary care providers (10%)
- Competent and compassionate health care providers (10%)
- Lower health care and insurance costs (8%)


